


GRANITE HARBOUR



Macmillan is an intuitive detective, so she'll often make decisions based on her gut - just like Davis - but this doesn't mean she's going to give this soldier carte blanche to do as he likes. EPISODE 1

Looking for a fresh start, Davis Lindo arrives in Aberdeen ready to begin training as a detective on the DUO commonality scheme. He is introduced to his new partner, DS Lara (Bart) Bartlett and it's not long before his team gets a case.

A body is found and identified as Clellan Coburn, the founder of Coburn Gas and Oil (CGO), a gas company which recently held an event to announce a merger with a Norwegian green energy company - headed by Karolina Andersen. The merger was not well received, causing consternation among the locals.

Lindo and Bart pay Shay Coburn, Clellan's brother, a visit. Lindo is suspicious of Shay but DCI MacMillan, head of Lindo's team, gives him an alibi. The team studies CCTV of the CGO event, and sees a man throwing a bottle at Clellan, and loudly threatening to kill him.





GRANITE HARBOUR MacMillan sends Lindo and Bart to Coburn's solicitor to obtain a copy of Clellan's will. It emerges that he recently changed the sole beneficiary from Shay Coburn to Karolina Andersen. After identifying the bottle-thrower from the film, Lindo and Bart head to the Bodach Stone pub. The man turns out to be a regular called Rory Dashford; an employee at CGO. They visit Rory's workplace where he tries to escape, but is arrested on suspicion of murder and taken in for questioning. His DNA ends up matching the DNA at the crime scene, although Isla Breck, the Bodach Stone's manageress, has evidence of Rory sleeping on her couch on the night of the murder. Lindo and Bart return to the Bodach Stone to speak to Isla but she's out for lunch - with none other than Karolina Andersen. The police are instructed to stay outside Karolina's hotel and not to engage, but when Isla emerges from the hotel they decide to follow her. Suddenly a white van pulls up alongside Isla, dragging her into the back. Lindo tries to stop the kidnapping by pulling himself into the back of the van as it moves off - leaving Bart to watch the van disappear into the distance. DOPAMINE BBC ecchorights



Lindo wakes outside the totalled van, with no sign of Isla or the driver. The team sets about establishing who might want her out of the picture. DI Jay Mallick speaks to Andersen, and finds out that she had offered Isla £2 million in compensation for the accident that killed her husband Frank, on a CGO rig 10 years earlier.

The team questions Shay who denies knowing Isla - the team knows he's lying since he was involved with CGO at the time of Frank's death. It also emerges that Ewan, Shay's right hand man, has gone AWOL.

Lindo is sent home to rest up with a warning not to disobey orders again, but he soon rejoins the team. The team suspects Isla's disappearance might not be a coincidence considering Clellan died 10 years to the day after her husband, and she's now missing with the promise of £2 million.

They search Isla's flat and find a photograph of Isla, Frank and a mysterious woman. Back at the station looking into the mysterious woman, Ewan suddenly shows up admitting to having kidnapped Isla on Shay's command. They agree and Ewan points the police towards a burner phone in Shay's office, with evidence incriminating Shay in his brother's death. Satisfied, MacMillan releases Ewan.

Lindo is engraged by MacMillian's decision, with Isla still missing. He puts up a fight and as a result, is thrown out of the team. However, he is not willing to give up yet.

At Rory Dashford's home there is a knock at the door. He goes to answer and Isla Breck stumbles inside.

Lindo's apartment is filled with notes across the walls, each suspect linked with another in great detail. Since being thrown off the team he has continued the investigation on his own.
