Jenny Challoner never had it easy, but she worked hard and built a life she'd always dreamt of, with husband Chris and daughter Rosie. She has a nice home and a job she loves - she's content.

That all changed six months ago, after she was involved in a train crash that killed 18 people and injured countless others - including Jenny. Ever since she has suffered silently from severe PTSD.

Six months on, Jenny is back at work and seems 'fine' - but underneath she's falling apart. Having found a coping mechanism in online gambling, she gambles any chance she can. The adrenaline rush helps her forget the horror of the crash - but it's come at a huge cost. After fraudulently remortgaging the family home and siphoning off their savings - Jenny borrowed £10.000 from a loan shark.

When Jenny is rescued during a panic attack by Sasha Santoro, she finds it easier to talk to a stranger than to Chris. As her bond with Sasha grows, Jenny's marriage and friendships suffer. When Sasha offers Jenny an illicit way to clear her debts, she initially baulks.

At work, Jenny's starts making mistakes, and her resentful colleague and one time replacement, Raj, soon becomes a source of mounting antagonism. Tired of covering for her, when he discovers Jenny's illegal activities, he gives her an ultimatum; come clean, or he'll expose her.

After Rosie hurts herself while Jenny is distracted playing poker, her guilt is overwhelming. As Rosie pulls away and Chris discovers the depth of Jenny's deceit, and she's asked to leave the family home, Jenny realises she'll do anything to keep her family together, even if it means turning to crime.

Sasha Santoro is the good samaritan who comes to Jenny's aid when she suffers a public panic attack. The two women strike up a friendship when they realise they're both going through tough times - Sasha has just lost her younger sister, Tara, to organ failure exacerbated by drug use. Her grief is overwhelming at times, although Sasha uses humour and sarcasm to deflect the depth of her pain.

Sasha is strong, confident, glamorous. She runs a successful online handbag business, and after a hefty divorce settlement, she lives in a large house in a nice part of town. When Jenny and Chris go to Sasha's for dinner, they're struck by how sparse and sterile her house is. Sasha is an enigma to most who meet her, but Jenny can empathise with Sasha's natural sense of detachment, Jenny thinks she 'gets' Sasha, and they become fast friends, confiding in one another.

Charismatic, and a good conversationalist, Sasha is a born saleswoman. She can persuade most people to do most things and Sasha proposes an illicit plan to Jenny that can help her settle her debts - stealing morphine from her station, to sell to a nurse who helps patients 'in need' at the hospice where Sasha's sister died.

We might think that Sasha is elaborately grooming Jenny as a way of getting her hands on the compensation money Jenny is due from the train crash, or maybe we'll think that Sasha just likes to toy with people. Whatever we think about Sasha in the early stages, we'd be right to be suspicious of her - that will never be hidden - but the real reason we need to be wary of this femme fatale is darker and more complex than anyone could imagine.
